1 Minute in the coffee

Mild To Warm With Minimal Rain Into Next Week - By Drew Lerner

Kansas City, August 24 (World Weather, Inc.) – Mild to warm temperatures and minimal ranifall will dominate coffee production areas in Brazil during the next week. Some increase in precipitation will be possible in the south during the middle to latter part of next week. There is no threat of frost.

Temperatures continued to contrast sharply across the coffee production areas of Brazil Tuesday. High temperatures were limited to the middle and upper teens through the lower 20s Celsius from northern Parana to eastern Minas Gerais, Espirito Santo and a few coastal areas of Bahia. Highs to the north were mostly in the upper 20s to lower 30s with one location in central Bahia reaching 36.

Rain Tuesday was confined to coastal Bahia where 2 to 19 millimeters resulted. The remainder of coffee country was dry. Mostly dry weather will occur in coffee production areas of Brazil during the coming week. The only exception will be in coastal Bahia where some persistent showers and thunderstorms may produce some locally heavy rainfall. Only light amounts of rain will drift inland into interior astern Bahia and no offee flowering is expected in the interior production areas. Daily rainfall along the coast will vary from 5 to 20 millimeters with a few greater amounts possible.

The first opportunity for more significant rain to fall in Parana and Sao Paulo will occur one week from today when 1 to 10 millimeters will evolve across parts of the production region. The rain will break up as it moves through northeastern Sao Paulo and into southern Sui de Minas and Rio de Janeiro September 1:2. A more significant rain event "may" evolve in the September 3:5 pende, although confidence is low.

Temperatures will gradually trend warmer over the next few days. Highs through Thursday will be in the upper teens and lower 20s from eastern Sao Paulo into Rio de Janeiro and southern Sui de Minas. A few areas in Zona de Mata and coastal Bahia may also experience some of the milder than usual conditions. Most areas further inland will experience highs in the middle 20s to the lower 30s with a few middle 30s continuing in central Bahia and far northern Minas Gerais. Low temperatures will vary in the upper single digits and teens except in Bahia where a few lower 20s may occur.

Temperatures during the weekend and most of next week will reach the middle 20s through the middle 30s throughout coffee country with the north still warmest. Lows most nights will be in the range of 10 to 18 most often, but a few upper single digit lows will occur in the traditionally cooler areas in the south while a few lows are in the lower 20s in far northern production areas mostly near the coast.


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
